- 1. What is the overall tone Buren takes in his essay?
- 2. Why does Buren say that the studio is the first "frame, the first limit, upon which all subsequent frames/limits will depend?
- 3. Buren talks about two types of studios? Which do you think best describes the Sculpture studio in the VES building? Why?
- 4. Why does Buren say that the studio is a "boutique"?
- 5. Buren states that if the artwork remains in the studio, it will result in "death...from starvation," for the artist. Why?
- 6. Buren talks about an experience he had at the age of 17. Why does he experience "deception" when he views the work of artists in an exhibition?
- 7. Which artist does Buren cite as resisting the Museum's desire to "classify, to embellish, and to select"? What does he say this artist manages to do?
- 8. Assuming Buren is opposed to an artist's studio, what do you think Buren would cite as an alternative?
